

PE and Sports Premium Funding at Kew Woods Primary School



Academic Year 2018-2019

The government are providing additional funding to improve provision of Physical Education (PE) and Sport in primary schools. The provision of this additional ring-fenced funding, specifically to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport schools offer, demonstrates the importance placed on PE and school sport by Government and this is something Kew Woods Primary School fully supports. Our vision for using the funding is that all of our pupils leaving Kew Woods will be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. The funding will be used to further develop and add to the PE and sports activities that we already offer and to build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will also benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

Kew Woods Primary School provisionally plans to use the funding we receive this academic year as listed below:

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport at Kew Woods Primary School

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and developing healthy active lifestyles (at least 60 minutes per day, 30 minutes per day in school / 30 minutes out of school)
- 2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
