#### **British Values at Kew Woods:**

At the heart of Kew Woods are our school's vision and values. We recognise that they are part of the wider British society, which is multi-cultural and multi-faith in its composition.

As a school and part of Southport Learning Trust we aim to improve life chances of all learners no matter what their background or circumstance. We do this through our values of connect, kindness and believe.

Our 'Kew Woods way' encourages us to do our best, be caring, kind and respectful. To listen and work together to become responsible citizens treating others with respect and tolerance in the process.

### Mutual Respect:

RE, Collective Worship and Life Learning encourage us to show respect for others.

We celebrate and recognise events throughout the year such as religious festivals and explore how and why they are celebrated (e.g. In RE - how festivals show what matters to Jewish people.)

We have bespoke events throughout the year such as 'Positive Noticing Day 'and 'Friendship Friday'.

We discuss current news stories regarding protected groups, exposing pupils to 'Big Picture News' and 'Newsround', and discussing the issues raised.

We have a range of class books on themes of equality and diversity.

We raise money for charities throughout the year such as Children in Need and Red Nose Day.

## Tolerance of different faiths and religions:

We learn about the beliefs of different religions and those with different beliefs through RE lessons and Collective Worship.

We discuss news stories when there is an opportunity for learning.

In life learning, we talk about how we are all unique in our beliefs.

We perform a nativity play every Christmas.

### Democracy:

We have a democratic process through the election of various committees, including School Council and Eco Council.
