

# #kNOwKnifeCrime campaign and mini marathon bleed control kit fundraiser April 2024

As a school we are always looking for opportunities and ways to educate our pupils on how to keep themselves safe. We have decided to team up again with #kNOwKnifeCrime campaign and London Marathon 2024 to fundraise for bleeding control kits and cabinets for outside schools in Sefton. Last July we had a fantastic campaign which enabled us to purchase several bleed control kits and a cabinet for outside our school. We now want to continue fundraising so we can see more cabinets around our local area. To do this we have teamed up with the London Marathon 2024.

## Nursery to Year 6 pupils – Mini marathon

We will be having a mini fun marathon event in our school **Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> April 2024** where all pupils will participate in running/walking 2.6 miles in our school grounds. For participating in this event all children will receive a London mini marathon certificate and our school will receive a trophy.

On Monday we will be having an assembly about how our mini marathon run will fundraise for more bleed control kits. Younger pupils will focus on life saving facts and how running/walking can keep us physically and mentally healthy. We will also discuss how we can achieve ambitious goals by setting ourselves the mini marathon challenge.

Next Thursday pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 will have an assembly with the #kNOwKnifeCrime campaigner Laura Hughes (who established in Memory of Colin McGinty) a - kNOwKnifeCrime initiative to educate young people on the wider lasting impact of knife crime. The assembly will be age appropriate and help children to consider choices they have. As part of our safeguarding work, we need to educate our pupils on the dangers they may be exposed to. The purpose of the fundraiser is not to scare or worry our community but to raise awareness of the possible risks and raise money to purchase bleed control kits for our local community.

On Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> April, 20 representatives from Year 5 and Year 6 will be participating in a relay event. The event will start at Kew Woods at 8am and we will run from our school to Meols Cop High passing on a 'bleed control kit'. Meols Cop High will then run on to the next school participating to show how we are working as a Southport Community to keep our community safe. All children in Year 5 and Year 6 will be supporting the event in some way, should they not be part of the running relay group. 84 schools in Sefton are participating in this event .There will also be relay events in Formby, Crosby, Bootle and Maghull.

To support the campaign, a fundraising link will be sent to parents/carers prior to the event to sponsor the children for the Mini Marathon and the Year 5 and Year 6 pupils representing our school during the #kNOwKnifeCrime campaign relay.












## Attending your appointment via video

5 -19 yrs - School Nurse Team - North Sefton Area.

Where appropriate, you can attend your consultation online via a video call.

Video calling is as convenient as a phone call, with the added value of face-to-face communication.

It can save you time and money, and brings your care closer to home.



#### Where do I go to attend my appointment?

Instead of travelling to your appointment, you enter the clinic's online waiting area. The health service is notified when you arrive, and your clinician will join you when ready.

There is no need to create an account. No information you enter is stored.

#### What do I need to make a video call?

- A good connection to the internet If you can watch a video online (e.g. YouTube) you can make a video call
- A private, well-lit area where you will not be disturbed during the consultation
- One of these:
  - Google Chrome web browser on a desktop or laptop, or on an Android tablet or smartphone
  - Safari web browser on an Apple iMac, MacBook, iPad, or iPhone
- Web-camera, speakers and microphone already built into laptops or mobile devices

#### a ls it secure?

Video calls are secure; your privacy is protected.

You have your own private video room that only authorised clinicians can enter.

#### How much internet data will I use?

You don't use any data while waiting for a clinician to join you.

A video call uses a similar amount of data to Skype® or FaceTime®.

#### ₤ How much does a video call cost?

The video call is free (except for your internet usage).



Smartphone and tablet users If you can, connect to a home or work Wi-Fi network to avoid using your mobile data allowance.
